I sit here and write today's devotion the day after the tragic school shooting at Robb Elementary School in Uvalde, TX.

My heart aches. I am filled with unspeakable anger that this has happened again. Our fractured world is too much to bear some days.

And yet, we need to be able to process these unspeakable events with loved ones, friends, and fellow church members. Healthy venting and honest, emotional conversation is a cathartic and helpful thing to do in times like this. More than anything we know we can and should pray for all those whose lives have been wrecked by the evil in this world.

But we also need to guard ourselves each day too. There is a type of dialogue that does not bring healing, but begets toxic cynicism. There is a dark place that these polarizing conversations can sometimes ebb and flow into that we need to be sensitive to.

Paul writes in 1 Timothy 6:20-21, ""Timothy, guard what has been entrusted to your care. Turn away from godless chatter and the opposing ideas of what is falsely called knowledge, which some have professed and in so doing have departed from the faith."

The ESV translation, instead of translating it "godless chatter" calls it "irreverent babble". There is a lot of unnecessary "godless and irreverent" talk in our culture today. It's the kind of communication that is laced

with an "us versus them" mentality and it often

Jesus called to the mat the Pharisees of his day for projecting one thing when inwardly they were selfish, prideful, and hypocrites behind all of the smoke screen of the veneer of their empty religiosity.
