
Winter Clothing Drive for J Good Samaritans of Garland and Toler Elementary

## From our Adopt-A-Student Seminarians

Dear Tree of Life Lutheran Church,

I want to reach out and thank you so much for your financial support that has allowed me to continue down this path of becoming a pastor. I want to give you a quick update about what is going on in my family's life to give you a snapshot of the people that you are supporting!

These last few months of been some of the most exciting, yet stressful, months of me and my wife Kali's lives. The most exciting news is the birth of our first daughter, Naomi Lynn Langewisch, on August 11. We are absolutely in love with her and she makes the lack of sleep that we are getting all worth it. She was baptized on the last Sunday of my Vicarage in Woodbury, MN which was very exciting. She has been a great baby and is growing so fast!

However, not everything was smooth sailing for us in August. We packed up all of our belongings in a POD and had it sent to St. Louis while we drove in our car separately. Our POD never arrived in St. Louis. No one from the company could tell us where our life's belongings were or when (or even if) they would arrive. We lived in an empty Seminary apartment with a new born for nearly a month. Fortunately, our friends here at the Seminary were so gracious to us, letting us come over to use whatever things we needed in the meantime. After countless phone calls, our POD finally arrived in late September. We are greatly anticipating the call that we will receive in April. We had our placement interview with the placement director, Dr. Glenn Nielsen.
