It is a sad reality. I believe we are living in a time where judgmentalism may be at an all-time high. Flip on the TV, the radio, or your favorite social media app on your phone or computer and you will find countless examples of people judging others for all sorts of things.

This is not the way of Jesus. The Bible is clear that judging others is not the way of the kingdom. Here are 2 passages from scripture that hammer this home.


James 4:11-12

"Brothers and sisters, do not slander one another. Anyone who speaks against a brother or sister or judges them speaks against the law and judges it. When you judge the law, you are not keeping it, but sitting in judgment on it. There is only one Lawgiver and Judge, the one who is able to save and destroy. But you—who are you to judge your neighbor?"

Matthew 7:1-5

(Jesus said), "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye."

So if God's word is so clear that we should not judge others, why do we do it? I think Jesus points it out to us in that last passage from Matthew's

gospel. It is so much easier for us to point out others flaws, foolishness, and sin than it is for us to look in the mirror and see our own sin. If the focus is on others and how "bad" they are compared to us then at a sinful, prideful level we think "we are off the hook" or "at least I am not as evil or messed up as so and so".

The story of the women caught in adultery in John 8 is another great example of how hypocritical we can be. We are sinners just like those we are judging. None of us are without sin.

A Word from the Pastor, continued

Romans 2:1

You, therefore, have no excuse, you who pass judgment on someone else, for at whatever point you judge another, you are condemning yourself, because you who pass judgment do the same things.

So, the remedy is staying in our lane and continuing to confess our daily sin before the Lord. When we are filled with pride, we confess that. When we are being stingy and lacking in generosity with the gifts God has blessed us with, we confess that. When we are lacking in love for our neighbor, we confess that. This is how, by the power of the Spirit, we guard ourselves from being that judgmental modernday Pharisee. By looking in the mirror and confessing, we keep our hearts clean to love those around us with the love of Christ.

In closing, I want to share with you two other thoughts. First, that along with confessing our sin when we fall short, I encourage us to follow that up with a simple prayer like this, *"Lord, help me to see ______ as you see them. Help me to love them because they are your beloved child too and they are made in your image just like I am. You died for them, whether they believe it or not. Love them in and through me. Amen*"

And then a quote from a Benedictine nun, Sister Mary Lou Kownacki who once said, "There isn't anyone you couldn't love once you've heard their story".

Slow down. Confess, pray and listen to the hearts of those with whom you have been prone to judge. Watch how Jesus changes your perspective and transforms your relationship with your neighbor. Let Jesus lead the way.

Be blessed and let us continue to rest in the unconditional love and grace of our beloved Savior Jesus.
