"Get Well Soon"

"Now there is in Jerusalem near the Sheep Gate a pool, which in Aramaic is called Bethesda and which is surrounded by five covered colonnades. Here a great number of disabled people used to lie—the blind, the lame, the paralyzed. One who was there had been an invalid for thirty-eight years. When Jesus saw him lying there and learned that he had been in this condition for a long time, he asked him, "Do you want to get well?" (John 5:2-6)

Raise your hand if you are not well?

That question could be taken and answered in many different ways, couldn't it? None of us probably wants to air out all of our dirty laundry or deepest wounds with the whole world. Many of us don't even like to admit to ourselves, let alone another, that we are "not ourselves". And yet, when we look at ourselves in the mirror, many of us have unresolved things that may cause us to feel "stuck". The brokenness of the world and the sin of our own hearts and those around us have an effect on us whether we want it to or not.

The story above from John's gospel is one about a man who hadn't been stuck for just a few days, or weeks, or years. No, he had been stuck and "not well" for nearly 4 decades!!! At first glance it may seem that Jesus is being highly insensitive when he poses to him a very personal question, "Do you want to get well?".

Picture Jesus asking you that question right now? I believe that Jesus has given us all that we need in His word and in His presence and in the body of His church to bring us healing, hope and freedom from our deepest hurts, selfish habits, and flawed ways of thinking. So, I am going to

challenge you with something and am going to offer you an invitation this Lent.

Would you join me and our church family for a 5 week sermon series on Wednesday night during these 40 days of Lent? If you can't make it physically to church every Wednesday, would you commit to listening to each week's message on our Facebook page and prayerfully join us as we walk the road of healing with Jesus leading us through it together? Many of us need Christ's restorative care mentally. emotionally, spiritually, and even physically. This year's Lenten series will be a step by step roadmap that can get us
